## 2005-06 IOWA CONFERENCE MEN'S BASKETBALL PREVIEW

**CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA . . .** Defending Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (IIAC) Champion Wartburg College, with three starters and 14 letterwinners returning, is the pick of the IIAC men's basketball coaches to repeat as Conference Champion in 2005-06.

The Knights garnered eight first-place votes for 72 points to finish ahead of Coe College (57 points), Loras College (one first-place vote, 53 points) and 2005 Tournament Champion Buena Vista University (53 points) in the IIAC men's basketball Coaches' Poll. Coe, which has three starters and nine letterwinners returning, received five second-place votes and a third-place vote. Loras has three starters and five letterwinners from its third-place team last year, received a first-place vote, two second-place and two third-place votes. Buena Vista, which has won four of the last six Conference Championships, lost all five starters and its top-six scorers from last year's NCAA qualifying team, received a second-place vote and three third-place votes.

**Returning All-Conference Performers:** Eight former All-Conference performers return to their teams' lineups this year led by two-time First Team All-Conference selection **Jason Steege**, a senior guard from Wartburg and 2004-05 IIAC Most Valuable Player **Nate Schmidt**, a senior forward/center from Wartburg. Both players were Second Team All-Region selections last season, Schmidt by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and d3hoops.com, and Steege by the NABC.

Loras and Luther also return two All-Conference performers. Senior guard **Greg King** was a Second Team All-Conference selection for Loras last year and senior guard **Bobby Stineman** was a First Teamer in 2002-03. Luther senior guard **Andy Rump** earned Second Team honors last year and senior forward **Jake Lappe** was a Second Team selection in 2003-04 but did not play last year.

Dubuque junior forward **Nick Thomas** was a First Team All-Conference and Third Team d3hoops.com All-Region selection last year. Simpson junior guard **Jason Parkinson** was a Second Team All-Conference selection in 2004-05.

**National Polls:** Wartburg is ranked in two national preseason polls. The Knights are ranked 14th by d3hoops.com and 16th by the DIII News. Buena Vista is listed among others receiving votes by d3hoops.com.

***New Coach:*** **Patrick Juckem** takes over as head coach at Coe replacing **Brent Brase**, who stepped down to become the women's coach at Cornell. Juckem spent six years at Lawrence College, including the last three as associate head coach.

***2005-06 Season:*** The 2005-06 men's basketball season begins on Friday, November 19. The first Conference game is Tuesday, November 29. IAC action hits full swing on Wednesday, January 4 and concludes with a six-team Conference Tournament in late February. Under a new Conference policy adopted in May 2005, the IAC basketball tournaments have changed from an eight-team format to a six-team format with the top two seeds receiving a bye in the first round. The Conference semifinals have also been switched from Friday night to Thursday night. The higher seeded team will host each game.
